

# What is Blending & Braiding?

The terms blending and braiding are frequently used, often together, and generally with little definition. However, they refer to two very different approaches to fiscal coordination.



Blending funding involves comingling the funds into one "pot" where case managers can draw down service dollars, personnel expenses can be paid, or other program needs can be met.




In contrast, braided funding involves multiple funding streams used to pay for all of the services needed by a given population, with careful accounting of how every dollar from each funding stream is spent.




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




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




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# **Braiding Example**



Eligibility

Front Door staff confirm eligibility & document allowable services.

#### **Client Experience**




The adult learner receives an array of allowable services from a variety of program staff.

# **Braiding Example**




Front Door staff determine adult learner is eligible for Funding Streams A and C.

This means adult can receive services 1, 2, and 3.


As services are delivered, Back Door staff bill Funding Stream A for Service 1 and Funding Stream C for Services 2 and 3.




