

High School Equivalency

Description

The High School Equivalency Test (HSE) test is a national test that may be taken in California by persons who are eighteen years of age or older, or who meet specific criteria for testing at age seventeen.

The High School Equivalency (HSE) test is administered statewide throughout the year.

Currently there are three approved HSE tests: (<u>GED[®]</u>, <u>HiSET[®]</u>, and <u>TASC</u>[™])

Topics tested on HSE tests include language arts/reading, language arts/writing, mathematics, science, and social studies

The average fee to take the test is \$140

Not eligible for all branches of military service

What You Need to Do

Complete the following:

- Be a California resident
- Test-takers must be 18 years old or meet specific criteria for testing at age seventeen
- Exams may NOT be taken online. You will need to locate an adult school in your area to sit for the exam
- Test-takers must complete the exam within the time frame provided for each section of the exam
- Candidates may retake the test in the failed subject area before completing the entire exam
- There is no wait period to retake the test should you fail
- Those who pass the exam will be awarded a California High School Equivalency Certificate
