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

Building Your Own OER: Tools you can use:

- Any tool that allows you to save to a standard format "editable" by another.
 - O Open Office vs MS® Office
 - O "Save as..." text or rich text format
- Online tools allow for editing
 - O Google Drive (free account)
 - O Shareable and editable
 - O Office 365 (Office Mix)

More Authoring Tools

oSpecialized tools especially for creating/remixing OER

■OER Commons^{*} – <u>Open Author</u>

■<u>CK12*-</u> find or create a standards-aligned FlexBook Textbook


<u>Amazon Inspire</u> (beta) -- open collaboration service for teachers

Thousands of proprietary tools (but no one could easily edit/remix them)

Getting Started in Open Author

Log in to OER Commons

From the Create drop down list choose "Resource Builder"



Going Live...

There are three basic steps to using Open Author:

Write -- Have an outline ready with the resources you want to use. (Standards too!)

Describe -- This section helps describe your work and align it to educational levels and standards

Submit -- Choose your license and publish to work for everyone to see on OER Commons

Log in -

Choose "browse all subjects"

Select English; then Writing.

Select the text "Commonsense Composition"
