Adult Dual Enrollment: Experiences & Strategies

San Joaquin Delta College's Directing Adults on to the Right TrAC for Employment (DARTE)

- Provides adult learners with an opportunity to be directed onto a career path and to jump start college
- Utilizes a small-sized cohort model
- Allows adult learners to earn high school diploma credits and college units (SB554)
- Allows adult learners who are earning their high school diplomas at an adult school to simultaneously finish transfer-level math and English college courses
- Open to any returning adult wanting to finish a certificate, to finish a degree, or to transfer to a four-year college
