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
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What is Noncredit CTE?

Programs in career technical education that are short term in nature with high employment potential.

Credit CTE

- Students pay enrollment fees
- Program length varies; typically a semester or longer
- Limited repeatability; restrictions apply after passing a course
- Courses may transfer to CSU/UC systems

Noncredit CTE

- No or low enrollment fees for students
- Program length is often shorter; designed for rapid skill acquisition and workforce entry
- Generally repeatable; students can retake courses as needed
- Generally non-transferable; designed for immediate workforce entry




Common Misconceptions

- X Misconception #1: "Noncredit programs don't lead anywhere."
- ✓ Noncredit CTE can lead directly to in-demand jobs, industry certifications, or credit-bearing certificate and degree pathways. It can be the *first* step on a career ladder.
- Misconception #2: "Employers only value credit-bearing or degree programs."
- ✓ Employers increasingly prioritize skills and certifications over formal degrees—
 especially in fast-growing industries like healthcare, logistics, and IT.

 Noncredit programs deliver the job-ready competencies that many employers are looking for.






Common Misconceptions

- X Misconception #3: "Noncredit students don't count in our metrics."
- ✓ Under CA's SWP and CAEP, noncredit students do count toward outcomes like employment, completion, and transition. And they generate enhanced FTES funding under CAEP.
- X Misconception #4: "Noncredit programs are only for basic skills or ESL."
- ✓ It also includes robust career education pathways that are workforce-aligned, stackable, and outcomes-focused.
- X Misconception #5: "Noncredit is just 'less than' credit."
- ✓ It's not remedial, it's responsive. It meets learners where they are, often removing financial, scheduling, and academic barriers that credit programs can't.
 And it can bridge directly to credit, acting as a feeder system for the college.









Why Noncredit CTE Matters

Removes Barriers to Entry

No or low tuition, open enrollment

Fast, Focused, and Flexible

Short-term programs that quickly upskill jobseekers

Serves Equity Priority Populations

Designed for adults who are unemployed, underemployed, returning to the workforce, or learning English

Aligns with Regional Workforce Needs

Targeted training for in-demand jobs (i.e., healthcare, logistics, tech support)

Creates On-Ramps to Credit Pathways

Stackable credentials and seamless transitions into credit-bearing programs

Responsive and Employer-Informed

Curriculum can be updated more nimbly to meet labor market shifts

This data view allows access to groups of metrics based on the segment of a student's academic experience including progress, success, employment and earnings.




Single Metric





Many residents with HSD or less -> prime audience for noncredit CTE


