Statewide data visualization system supported by the Community College Chancellor's Office and hosted by Cal-PASS Plus, provides data on progress, employment, and earnings outcomes for community college pathways, adult education, and K14 career pathways.

This information is intended to facilitate local, regional, and statewide conversations about how to foster economic mobility.

What about Dashboards

- 1. Dumb Better window into programs & students
- 2. Don't collect or fix your data
- 3. Only useful based on questions you want to ask
- 4. Not meant to replace existing enrollment and data collection systems
- 5. Tool for program improvement







- People want to know what happens to their students
- 2. Change the conversation w leadership, faculty, electeds
- 3. Support robust conversations about service improvement
- 4. Planning 3 year plan process
- Better reporting to funders and state agencies

AEBG Data and Accountability

Legislative and member accountability, field teams, data collection, reporting and visualization





AB104: Data and Accountability Requirements

Identify common measures for determining effectiveness of members of consortia in meeting educational needs of adults

Align data used for reporting with data reported by local agencies for other purposes such as WIOA (Perkins, Strong Workforce)

Establish common assessments and policies regarding placement of adults into adult education program, measuring needs of adults, and effectiveness of providers

Report twice yearly to the legislature: Preliminary Report October 30th; Final Report March 1st after the end of the previous program year (July 1 to June 30th)





AB104: Data for Measuring the Effectiveness of Consortia:

- (1) How many adults are served by the consortium.
- (2) How many adults served by the consortium have demonstrated the following:
 - (A) Improved literacy skills.
 - (B) Completion of high school diplomas or their recognized equivalents.
 - (C) Completion of post-secondary certificates, degrees, or training.
 - (D) Transition into post-secondary education
 - (E) Placement into jobs.
 - (F) Improved Wages

LaunchBoard



- Practitioner driven by educators who want more consistent and comprehensive information on CTE student outcomes
- Practitioner facing providing data to educators on student progress, completion, employment, and earnings outcomes
- Free to educational institutions who are CalPASS Members
- Data is FERPA Suppressed no data for cohorts smaller than 10 students
- Multiple accountability tools Strong Workforce Program, K14 Transitions, Guided pathways and Adult Ed
- Leverages existing data sets to support practitioner inquiry, planning, program improvement, and student equity
- Development team includes WestEd, Educational Results Partnership, RP Group, and Centers of Excellence





Also a Data Connector

- **Student and program** data, including characteristics, progress, and completion from the CCCCO MIS database (populated by colleges)
- Employment and earnings data from Employment Development Department UI wage file
- **Employment outcomes** compiled from the CTE Outcomes Survey
- Labor market information from EMSI
- **K12 information** from CALPADS (uploaded by K12 Cal-PASS Plus members)
- **K12 adult education data** collected by CASAS through TOPSpro Enterprise including CASAS testing and EFL attainment data

- Focus Groups with DAC and State Staff
- Builds upon Measuring Our Success Metrics and other data points requested by adult education practitioners
- Organized by Student Momentum Points
- Includes a special view of just the Major Reporting Metrics to the legislature for quick reference by practitioner
- Matches K12 enrollment and MIS datasets and EDD wage file data to accurately capture postsecondary transition, completion, and employment after exit (some will take time to populate)
- **Data Element Dictionary** includes 88 distinct metrics and data points

- Only One Year of K12 Unitary Student Data
- Transition and Employment Data Only Available for Noncredit
- Using Noncredit Data Only for the College Build
- Expand better disaggregate and measurable skills gain data by quarter and program
- At this time cannot disaggregate data by pathway within program areas – CTE pathways and sectors

- Identifies all limitations for use of data by CalPASS including when data can be accessed for research or is subject to limited public release of aggregate data.
